Anna & Peter H 21 cm

Anna:

Off-white: 75 g

Grey: 10 g

Peter:

Dark grey: 75 g

Off-white: 10 g

Ellie H 9 cm:

Grey: 5 g

Brown: 10 g

MATERIALS

Buttons

Sewing thread, Grey

Filling

Metal wire: D2 mm x 2.5 m

Eyes: 8 mm and 5 mm


Double-pointed needles: 3.0 mm

YARN USAGE

Anna & Peter H 21 cm, Ellie H 9 cm

Anna:

Off-white 75 g
Grey 10 g

Peter:

Dark grey 75 g
Off-white 10 g

Ellie:

Grey 5 g
Brown 10 g

MATERIALS:

Buttons

Sewing thread, Grey

Filling

Metal wire D2 mm x 2.5 m

Eyes: 2 pairs of 8 mm, 1 pair of 5 mm

Double-pointed needles: 3.0 mm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only

ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s)	Stitch(es)
k	Knit
p	Purl
yo	Yarn over
M1B	Increase (lift the loop between the stitches from behind with the left needle. Work it as a knit stitch).
k 2 in same st	Increase. Knit from the front and back in same stitch before it is taken off the needle.
k2tog	Decrease. Knit 2 sts together
SSK	Slip, Slip, Knit. (decrease) Slip 2 stitches knit-wise one at a time. Insert left needle through front loop of both sts and k2 tog.
VLA	Loosen 1 st of the yarn ahead of piece, tighten well when the next st is knit.
RLA	Loosen 1 st of the yarn behind the work, tighten well until the next st is knit.
I-cord	Knit on 2 double-pointed needles. Instead of turning the work, push the stitches to the other end of the needle. Use the thread from the back and knit the row again. Repeat this. In this way, a tail is formed.

ANNA & PETER

BODY (DARK GREY/OFF-WHITE)

Cast on 8 stitches with Dark grey (Peter) or Off-white (Anna) distributed on 3 needles and knit in the round (stockinette stitch).

1.)	*k 2 in same st*	(16)
2.)	*k 2 in same st, 1 k*	(24)
3.)	*k 2 in same st, 2 k*	(32)
4.)	*k 2 in same st, 3 k*	(40)
5. - 20.)	k	(40)
21.)	15 k, k2tog x 5, 15 k	(35)
22.)	15 k, 1 SSK, 1 k, k2tog, 15 k	(33)
23. - 26.)	k	(33)
27.)	*3 k, k2tog* x 6, 3 k	(27)
28. - 29.)	k	(27)
30.)	*k2tog, 2 k* x 6, 1 k	(20)
31. - 32.)	k	(20)
33.)	*k2tog, 1 k* x 6, k2tog	(13)
34.)	k	(13)

Pull the yarn through the stitches.

Fill the body with filling and sew the top hole closed.

ASSEMBLY WITH WIRE FOR ARMS, LEGS, AND TAIL

TAIL (DARK GREY/OFF-WHITE)

Cast on 4 stitches with Dark grey (Peter) or Off-white (Anna).

Knit an I-cord (see explanation on page 3) until the work measures 18 cm.

Cut the yarn, pull it through the stitches with a darning needle, and pull tight.

1. Cut a piece of wire about 25 cm long.
2. Bend one end of the wire 1 cm down/inward – this will form the tip of the tail.
3. Insert the wire piece into the back of the mouse's body so that it extends up to the opening.
4. At the opening, make a 1 cm bend in the wire so it goes back down into the body by about 3-5 cm.

This gives the mouse balance, as the wire functions as a tail that stabilizes the mouse.

Insert the wire into the tail. Sew the tail on.

HEAD (DARK GREY/OFF-WHITE)

Cast on 8 stitches with Dark grey (Peter) or Off-white (Anna) and knit back and forth (stockinette stitch).

1.)	*k 2 in same st*	(16)
2.)	p	(16)
3.)	*k 2 in same st, 1 k*	(24)
4.)	p	(24)
5.)	*k 2 in same st, 2 k*	(32)
6. - 16.)	Stockinette stitch	(32)
17.)	2 k, *k2tog, 3 k*	(26)
18. - 20.)	Stockinette stitch	(26)
21.)	*2 k, k2tog*	(20)
22. - 24.)	Stockinette stitch	(20)
25.)	2 k, *k2tog, 1 k*	(14)

26. - 27.) Stockinette stitch (14)
 Switch to Off-white (Peter) or Grey (Anna).
 28.) p (14)
 29.) 2 k, k2tog x 5, 2 k (9)
 30.) p (9)
 31.) 2 k, k2tog, 1 k, k2tog, 2 k (7)


Cut the yarn, pull it through the stitches, pull them tight, and sew the head together, leaving a small opening.

Fill the head with filling.

Shape the head/eye sockets:

Insert the needle beneath the head and up the inner side of the eye. Sew over a stitch at the eye stem, and lead the needle out beneath the head. Then, insert the needle through the next stitch and up the inner side of the other eye. Again, sew over a stitch at the eye stem, and once again, lead the needle out beneath the head. Tighten the thread, allowing the tension to create indentations. Hold the tension and tie two knots to preserve the indentations. The eye sockets are done. The shaping of the head/eye sockets can also be done before the eyes are mounted.

Embroider a "Y" with Grey sewing thread as the snout and embroider a small nose in the same sewing thread between the "arms" of the Y.



EAR (DARK GREY/OFF-WHITE, 2 X)

Cast on 7 stitches with Dark grey (Peter) or Off-white (Anna) and knit back and forth (stockinette stitch).

- 1.) p (7)
 2.) *1 k, M1B* x 6, 1 k (13)
 3.) p (13)
 4.) 3 k, M1B, 7 k, M1B, 3 k (15)
 5. - 8.) Stockinette stitch (15)
 9.) k (15)

Switch to Off-white (Peter) or Grey (Anna).

10. - 13.) Stockinette stitch (15)
 14.) 2 k, k2tog, 7 k, k2tog, 2 k (13)
 15.) p (13)
 16.) *k2tog* x 6, 1 k (7)

Cut the yarn, pull it through the stitches with a darning needle, and pull tight.

Fold the ear at the crease and sew a few stitches to hold it together.

Sew the ears onto the head 3 cm above the eyes and 5 cm apart.

ARMS (DARK GREY/OFF-WHITE, 2 X)

Cast on 12 stitches with Dark grey (Peter) or Off-white (Anna), distributed on 3 needles, and knit in the round (stockinette stitch).

1. - 8.) k (12)
 9.) k2tog, 10 k (11)
 10.) 3 k, k2tog, 6 k (10)
 11.) 6 k, k2tog, 2 k (9)
 12. - 13.) k (9)
 14.) k2tog, 7 k (8)
 15.) 2 k, k2tog, 4 k (7)
 16.) 4 k, k2tog, 1 k (6)
 17. - 18.) k (6)

Switch to Off-white (Peter) or Grey (Anna).

19. - 26.) k (6)

Pull the yarn through the stitches.

Cut approx. 2 x 20 cm of wire.

Bend the wire 1 cm down at one end; this is the hand.

Insert the wire into the arm as shown in the illustration (page 2).

Add filling.

Place the other end of the wire on the body, at the shoulders, and sew the arm on.

Repeat for the other arm.

Bend the arms at the color change so the mouse has hands.

LEGS (DARK GREY/OFF-WHITE, 2 X)

Cast on 15 stitches with Dark grey (Peter) or Off-white (Anna), distributed on 3 needles, and knit in the round (stockinette stitch).

1. - 10.)	k(15)	
11.)	k2tog, 13 k	(14)
12.)	4 k, k2tog, 8 k	(13)
13.)	8 k, k2tog, 3 k	(12)
14. - 16.)	k	(12)
17.)	k2tog, 10 k	(11)
18.)	3 k, k2tog, 6 k	(10)
19.)	6 k, k2tog, 2 k	(9)
20. - 21.)	k	(9)
22.)	k2tog, 7 k	(8)
23.)	2 k, k2tog, 4 k	(7)
24.)	4 k, k2tog, 1 k	(6)
25.)	k	(6)

Switch to Off-white (Peter) or Grey (Anna).

26. - 37.)	k	(6)
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Pull the yarn through the stitches.

Cut about 2 pieces of wire, each 15 cm long.

Bend the wire 1 cm down at one end; this is the

foot.

Insert the wire into the leg as shown in the illustration (page 2).

Add filling

Place the other end of the wire at the bottom of the body, and sew the leg on.

(See link on page 4 for assembly.)

Repeat for the other leg.

Bend the legs at the color change so the mouse has feet.

Sew the head onto the body.

 39.) p (7)
 40.) 1 RLA, 1 SSK, 4 k (6)

Now cut the yarn, leaving about 20 cm

Place the stitches from the back piece and front piece together, right side to right side, on one shoulder and knit the stitches together with the 20 cm yarn while casting off. Do the same on the other shoulder.

Sew the dress together from the bottom up to the Dark grey stripe.

Fold the edge at the bottom of the dress so that the row of holes forms "mouse teeth" and sew it to the wrong side with overcast stitches all the way around.

Sew a piece of yarn onto the left back piece about 2 cm from the shoulder edge and make a loop for a buttonhole. Sew buttonhole stitches all the way around the loop. Cast off.

Sew the small button on the corresponding spot on the opposite back piece.

Weave in all remaining ends on the dress.

DUNGAREES (DARK GREY)

Trouser legs:

Cast on 20 stitches and knit back and forth.

1. - 2.) k (20)
 3. - 7.) Stockinette stitch (start with purl) (20)
 8.) 1 k, M1B, 18 k, M1B, 1 k (22)
 9. - 11.) Stockinette stitch (22)
 12.) 1 k, M1B, 20 k, M1B, 1 k (24)
 13. - 15.) Stockinette stitch (24)

Cut the yarn and knit another trouser leg, but this time do not cut the yarn. Now join the legs together:

- 16.) 24 k, Continue with the 1st leg, 24 k (48)

- 17.) p (48)
 18.) 1 k, M1B, 10 k, M1B, 2 k, M1B, 10 k, M1B, 2 k, M1B, 10 k, M1B, 2 k, M1B, 10 k, M1B, 1 k (56)
 19. - 29.) Stockinette stitch (56)
 30.) 1 k, k2tog, 8 k, 1 SSK, 2 k, k2tog, 8 k, 1 SSK, 2 k, k2tog, 8 k, 1 SSK, 1 k (48)
 31. - 34.) Stockinette stitch (48)
 35.) 20 k, 8 p, 20 k (48)
 36.) k (48)
 37.) Cast off 20 sts, 2 k, 4 p, 2 k, cast off 20 sts (8)
 38.) k (8)
 39.) 2 k, 4 p, 2 k (8)
 40. - 43.) Repeat rows 38 - 39 twice (8)
 44. - 46.) k (8)
 Cast off in knit.

Braces (2 x):

Cast on 20 stitches and knit back and forth.

- 1.) k (20)
 2.) p (20)
 Cast off in purl.

Assembly:

Sew both trouser legs together up to the crotch, and fasten off.

Leave the back seam open so the tail can stick out.

Sew a button at the top of the back waistband.

Sew a piece of yarn on the opposite side of the button and make a loop for a buttonhole. Sew buttonhole stitches all the way around the loop.

Fasten off.

Sew the straps on so they form a cross on the back.

Finally, sew a felt heart on the bib with small running stitches.

ELLIE

BODY (BROWN)

Cast on 6 stitches, distributed on 3 needles, and knit in the round (stockinette stitch).



EARS (BROWN, 2 X)

Cast on 10 stitches, distributed on 3 needles, and knit in the round (stockinette stitch).

- 1.) k 2 in same st, 4 k, k 2 in same st, 4 k (12)
- 2.) k 2 in same st, 5 k, k 2 in same st, 5 k (14)
- 3.) k 2 in same st, 6 k, k 2 in same st, 6 k (16)
- 4.) k (16)
- 5.) SSK, 6 k, k2tog, 6 k (14)
- 6.) SSK, 5 k, k2tog, 5 k (12)
- 7.) SSK, 4 k, k2tog, 4 k (10)

Pull the yarn through the stitches, pull tight, and fasten off. Sew the ears onto the head.

ARM (BROWN, 2 X)

Cast on 4 stitches.

1. - 10.) I-cord (4)

Pull the yarn through the stitches, pull tight, and fasten off. Sew the arms onto the body.

LEGS (BROWN, 2 X)

Cast on 5 stitches.

1. - 8.) I-cord (5)

Pull the yarn through the stitches, pull tight, and fasten off. Sew the legs onto the body.

DIAPER (GREY)

Cast on 3 stitches and knit back and forth (stockinette stitch).

- 1.) p (3)
- 2.) 1 k, M1B, 1 k, M1B, 1 k (5)
- 3.) p (5)
- 4.) 1 k, M1B, 3 k, M1B, 1 k (7)
- 5.) p (7)
- 6.) 1 k, M1B, 5 k, M1B, 1 k (9)

Continue with increases on each side on all right-side rows until there are 25 stitches in total. Cast off loosely. Weave in the ends.

Hold the diaper together with a button or a few stitches.





Good to know

Needle Size + Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.



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
